### 2020-2021 Chrissy Bobb Community College STEM Scholarship

**Who:** This scholarship is for graduating and recently graduated (within two years) high school seniors who have chosen to attend Anne Arundel Community College. This scholarship is to help pursue a STEM education followed by a career in the Defense, Intelligence, or Homeland Security communities.

**What:** Each scholarship is to be applied towards the student's academic education. Each scholarship will be \$5,000, \$2,500 each of two years of the degree program. This is for a full-time student. AFCEA scholarship funds may be used **only for tuition, books, labs, and fees.**

**Criteria:** Applicants must:

- Be an academically competitive, well-rounded, graduating high school senior (or recently graduated within two years) who volunteers in the community.
- Have attended a public high school in Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Carroll, or Howard Counties.
- Be pursuing a two-year Associates' degree at Anne Arundel Community College.
- Be a U.S. Citizen.
- Have a cumulative high school GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Plan to enter a field of study supportive of national defense (i.e., systems engineering; software engineering; math; cyber; information technology; electrical engineering; computer engineering; computer science; physics; mechanical engineering; or materials science; or engineering relating to IT, communications, or electronics) and can apply their studies directly to the Intelligence Community, homeland security, or national defense objectives. **Please note: If you plan to pursue a degree in other sciences to include pre-med, pre-law, nursing, biology, environmental, or any form of engineering not listed in this section, you are unlikely to be considered for this scholarship.** If you are unsure, please email [scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org](mailto:scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org) to clarify.
- Stay in a field of study supportive of national defense for each of the applicant's two years and graduate.

**Maintenance:** Scholarship recipients must maintain a collegiate cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 to retain the scholarship for both years. Recipient may change majors provided the new major is a science and engineering field of study supportive of national defense as indicated above. Recipient must submit a transcript for review at the end of the school year with a status form (to be sent to the recipient in June) to report how their studies are progressing to be eligible to receive the next payment as the scholarship is paid out over the two years of the degree program.

**Ceremonies:** Scholarship recipients will be notified in late February/early March, 2021. The AFCEA Central Maryland Chapter will invite the recipient and their parents to an Awards Night reception and dinner honoring them in early May, 2021.

All interested students must submit their completed applications online by **December 18, 2020.**

**APPLICATION:** Student scholarship submissions must include **all** of the following: (Applicants will receive email from the Scholarship chair as materials are received. If applicant does not get an email, reach out to the email address above.)

1. A completed application **submitted online** (<https://centralmd.afceachapters.org/scholarship-application>) which includes **general information** about the applicant. (Sample application details the info to be submitted.)
2. A **750-1000 word essay** written by the applicant addressing: (1) How your activities (i.e., academic studies, extra-curricular activities, and volunteering, employment, sports, etc.) to date have prepared you for the future and (2) How your collegiate study of systems engineering; software engineering; math; cyber; information technology; electrical engineering; computer engineering; computer science; physics; mechanical engineering; materials science; or engineering relating to IT, communications, or electronics might prepare you for a career supporting intelligence, homeland security, or national defense objectives. Please be sure to address your volunteer activities in this essay. If you have graduated from high school within the last two years (i.e., are not a graduating senior this year), please also describe your activities in that timeframe and why you are now applying to AACC. (submit with on-line application)
3. A **resume** from the applicant detailing, at a minimum, accomplishments, work experience, and community involvement. (**submit this as an attachment to the on-line application**).
4. An **official, certified high school transcript** of completed courses and grades mailed **directly** from the high school to the address above or **emailed directly from the high school** to [scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org](mailto:scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org).
5. **Test scores:** A copy of the applicant's SAT or ACT scores from the testing center. If you do not have SAT or ACT scores and have PSAT scores or equivalent, please provide those scores. Please submit applicable AP test scores. While there is no requirement for minimum test scores this year due to coronavirus challenges, the Evaluation Committee will take test scores into consideration if they are provided. Please email the official report that you receive from the testing center for all test scores to be submitted to [scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org](mailto:scholarships@centralmd.afceachapters.org). Please note that AFCEA is not listed as a site that scores be sent to, so you will have to scan the report and email or mail to the P.O. Box address above. Be sure that the report has your full name on it.
6. **Two letters of recommendation:** one letter must be from an academic person (i.e., a school official – teacher, principal) and the second letter must be from a non-academic person (i.e., a person outside of school – clergy, a person you work/intern for, a volunteer leader, a coach). **Letters from school counselors are not acceptable.** Letters should be specific to this scholarship and not be letters that are for entry to a university or college. Please be sure to follow up with the persons who are emailing letters of recommendation to ensure that they have submitted them.

On-line application will be available October 1<sup>st</sup>.
